

Shane Broadway Bio Continued

Broadway was a member of the Governor's cabinet as well as the Governor's Workforce Cabinet, an appointed group of state government leaders charged with creating 21st Century jobs and skilled workers. Broadway served three terms as a representative Saline County, and two terms in the senate for Pulaski and Saline counties. He was elected Speaker of the House by his colleagues in 2001 becoming the youngest Speaker of the House in Arkansas history.

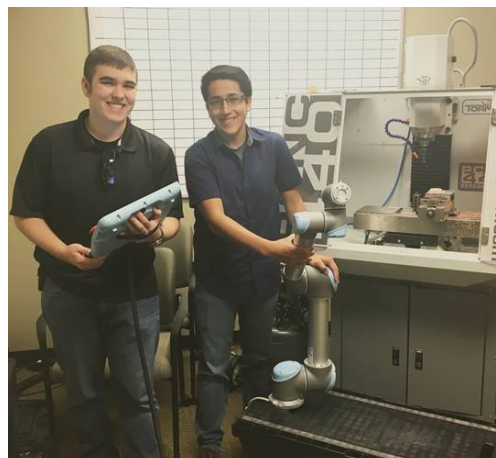
